# Be careful what you pray for ...

because you might get more than you bargained for. We spend a fair amount of time talking about and emphasizing prayer, and all of us probably have some form of prayer life. But often prayer becomes a secondary or assumed activity, right? Regularly we say we'll pray for someone or we put a name on our prayer list, but does prayer really happen? Do we actually specifically pray for that person? And if we do, is it authentic and specific? And I am speaking to myself with some of these questions, because I struggle to make sure I purposefully and authentically pray at times, but I've found that when I do, often things happen that I don't expect.

And this is speaking more specifically about prayers that impact me personally rather than praying for those on our prayer list, but I've found that when I pray, things change. And it's not often that the circumstances or the situation changes so much as I change. Or at least my heart, mind and emotions change.

Henri Nouwen writes, "Christians mention one another in prayers and in so doing bring help and even salvation to those for whom they pray." And he adds this important point, "Prayer allows us to lead into the center of our hearts not only those who love us but also those who hate us. This is possible only when we are willing to make our enemies part of ourselves and thus convert them first of all in our own hearts." (You Are Beloved, 153)

I understand Nouwen as saying that if we're going to pray, something happens in our hearts, at the center of our being. And what, and who, we pray for can certainly change the circumstances and the situation (as God miraculously works) but more importantly (I believe) our centers are changed toward what we're praying for.

What I mean, especially in terms of praying for others, is that it's easy to pray for loved ones because they are already in our hearts. It's much more difficult to pray for an enemy or someone who hates us because prayer brings them into our hearts (at least it should). And so, if we're going to pray for our enemies (which Jesus clearly instructs in Matt 5.44) it means they will need to enter into our hearts. They will be at the center of our lives. And when we start to do that, it starts to change us. And whether that's people or situations or circumstances, if we're truly praying intimately and personally about it, our hearts should be changed toward it. And we should see them or it more and more from God's perspective.

And so, I want to challenge us. If we're praying and our hearts aren't being changed in it, we might consider evaluating our prayers or our attitude. And if we're not praying, especially for those we hate or dislike, then I pray we open our hearts to what God wants to do in us through it. Serving Him and you,
