And not necessarily the building, but the community that is the church. And we get comfortable hiding. We feel safe there. We don't experience as much pain or discomfort there. But what about those who haven't seen or experienced that same refuge? If we stay hidden among it, how do we expect others to know and experience it? Don't we want that for others? I know that as I've found the safety and comfort of the church more and more, I long for others to feel it to and I pray you'll join me in helping others experience the safe refuge that the church can be.
